

Stacked Wool Tree



Materials:

Three fat quarters of wool or three ¼ yard pieces of wool
3/16" dowel 12" long sharpened at one end (or wooden skewer)

A wood base (I use a slice of white birch with a hole drilled in the center)

A star for the top

Tools:

Hot glue gun

Awl

From each piece of wool, cut the following square pieces. Use a pinking rotary blade or pinking shears.

6 - 5"

4 - 4 ½"

4 - 4"

4 - 3 ½"

3 - 3"

3 - 2 ½"

3 - 2"


3 - 1 ½"

3 - 1"

Starting with the 5" pieces, find the center of each piece, pierce with an awl, then add to the dowel. Alternate colors and rotate each piece slightly as you put them on the dowel. When all the wool has been added, hot glue the star on the top. Push the wool up to the star. Hot glue the dowel into the base.
