1. Continuous Oval Mat

Brief Description: In this class participants will braid and lace a 12x18" table mat. The skills learned in the making of this mat will allow you to make any sized oval rug!

Braid Level: Beginner

Sessions: Three

Prerequisite Skills: None

Folds: Left Opening

2. Braiding Traditional, Ornamental, Colorful Indian Corn Cobs

Brief Description: Learn how to braid colorful ornamental corn cobs that are a reasonable facsimile of real Indian Corn—husks and all. Learn how to braid a cylinder to a literal point and finish. Choose your own variety of corn, color, size and finishing touches.

Preferably, bring your own wool (1" pre-folded strips in one to three colors of Dorr weight solid, textured, plaid, or hit-or-miss; two full-width strips of each of your three choices - for example, six, 60" long, one-inch strips for one ear of corn.) Other wool choices will be available if needed. Also available will be ribbons, cords, twine, and samples for finishing ideas at low cost (donation to RBI only)

Braid Level: Intermediate

Sessions: Two

Prerequisite Skills: Must have braided a round rug or chair pad before; some hand-sewing experience helpful.

Folds: Left Opening

Kit: --

Max/Min Number Students: 10 max; 1 minimum.

Teacher Bio: Sandy has braided for almost 20 years. She has a Bachelor's degree in Journalism with an emphasis in Photojournalism. Related Background skills: braiding, knitting, spinning, plying, dying, needlepoint, cross stitch, floral, photography. She has taught rug braiding in Oregon, Canada, and Montana.



3. Pentagon Star Mat with Chevron Border

Brief Description: Learn how to make this all-butted pentagon star mat with a chevron border. From a 5-loop center, arrange colors and double corners to create the star design. Learn to lace stacked double corners. Finish with braiding and butting a cornered chevron border.

Braid Level: Intermediate

Sessions: 3

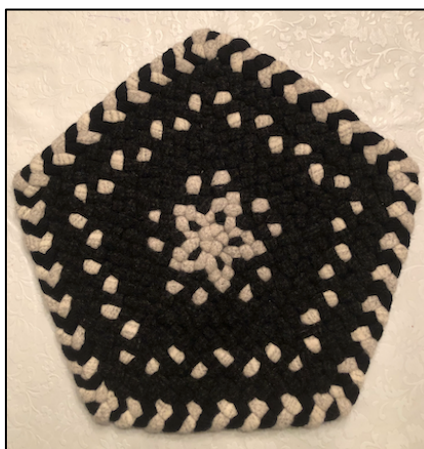
Prerequisite Skills: Must know how to butt by Triangle method.

Folds: Teacher is RO or LO and students can be RO or LO

4. Wide Butted Multistrand Tote Bag

Brief Description: Learn how to braid and butt a wide multistrand, and then braid a tote bottom and handles to fit around the butted MS braid. Although photo shows 31 strands, we will work with 25 in class. Learn the tips and tricks for working with many strands!

Braid Level: Advanced

Sessions: 3

Prerequisite Skills: Must be comfortable with butting 3-strand braids before learning to butt multistrands. Some experience with smaller multistrands would be helpful.

Folds: Left Opening or Right Opening

Max/Min Number Students: 12 maximum, 2 minimum

5. Braided Leaf

Brief Description: Learn to braid and taper a leaf shape to add to your Braided Garden Challenge Rug! The shape is created by using a twisted center; later rows stack double corners to create the leaf point. Finish with a taper.

Braid Level: Intermediate

Sessions: Two

Prerequisite Skills: Must have braided and laced a rug before.

Folds: Left Opening

Kit: \$20 kit includes recycled green wools to braid the leaf and dyed green lacing cord. A more expensive kit of hand-dyed green wools will be available for purchase at the conference.

Max/Min Number Students: 8/2

Teacher Bio: Rose learned to braid from classes at Dorr Mill in 2006. Since then, she has taught rug braiding locally in her home, at community centers, and at braiding conferences. She has an Etsy shop, Idlewild Wool, where she sells recycled wool from used clothing. In addition to braiding, Rose is a seamstress, doll-maker, gardener, and enjoys smocking. She runs a bed and breakfast – Lucinda's House -- from her historic property near Nashville.

7. Continuous Braided Tool Basket

Brief Description: In this class participants will braid and lace a tool basket. Beginning with a T-Start, braid double corners to make the round, and then make increases in loop counts to keep the basket bottom flat.

After several rows, stop increasing to make the straight sides. Finishing options will be explored, including a pretty wool flower embellishment!

8. Multistrand Strip Rug

Brief Description: Learn to work with 5 to 7 strands at once in a multistrand braid; learn to arrange braids to form additional patterns. Optionally include 3-strand braids between multistrands. Finish the ends with a herringbone-stitch finish using lacing cord. The ends are fringed.

Prerequisite Skills: Must have braided and laced a rug before.

Max/Min Number Students: 12/2

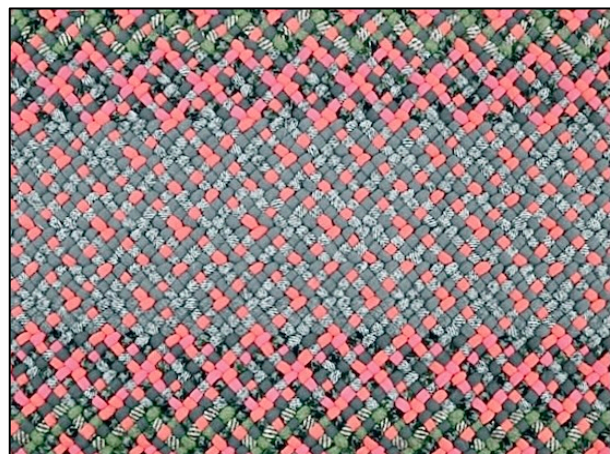
Folds: Left Opening or Right Opening
